Bills Rep. Mena is working on:

Youth contact and diversion- issue citations for non violent crimes instead of arrests

Resilient Youth and trauma informed act- enhanced training and tools for educators

Non unanimous jury- 2500 still incarcerated due to split jury decisions and most are elderly.

Bill will provide for retrial or plead them out. If it passes, the next step is a constitutional amendment for voters.
